Years events

The Club has had another successful year with a total of 38 walks held, and no incident or accident reports recorded. The walks have been interesting and varied and walk attendance has been high. Membership numbers remain steady at around 60, with 2 new members and 9 not renewing. A healthy bank account balance has meant that membership fees can remain the same for 2023.

Patsy Roche

It was with much sadness that we learned of Patsy Roche's passing on 11 November 2022. Patsy was elected a member of the club on 7 July 1983; was Treasurer for eight years from 1990 to 1997; and was the club's first honorary life member, being elected on 22 March 1998. (She was followed by Dave Foster who was elected a life member in 2005.)

Patsy led numerous walks and organised many social events. She assisted Dave Foster with Bibbulmun Track maintenance for several decades and was always present at our annual Christmas function and AGM.

A memorial service was held for Patsy on 07 December and a number of members attended.
